PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Mankachar College was established in 1971 with Arts Stream alone. An organizing meeting for establishing the college was held on the 8th day of March, 1970 in the j.M.H.S School premises with Late Zahirul Islam, the then MLA of Mankachar LA. Constituency in the chair. He was the President of the Organizing Governing Body of the college and Sri Shankarlal Agarwala, M.Com, LL.B. was the Secretary of the college till 1981. The college came under Deficit Grants-in-Aid system on 1st September, 1981. The general people of the locality contributed generously for the development of the college. So, the college was nomenclature as "Mankachar College". The College is affiliated to Gauhati University and registered under Section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act. 1956.

The College started with 68 male and 11 female students in the Mankachar J.M.H.S. School premises with the classes being taken in the morning shift. The college was shifted to it's own campus in January, 1979. The land of the college was donated in the memory of Late Fazal Sheikh of Sarkarpara by members of his family on the 26th day of May 1973.

Subsequently, in 1999, science stream at the degree level has been introduced to meet the requirement of the aspiring students of the locality. However, this stream is yet to be provincialised.

Shri Mihir Kr. Dev, M.A., B.T., E.T. the founder principal of the college adorned the principal's chair for a pretty long period of time till his retirement on 28th February, 1999. He was succeeded by Dr. Ahijuddin Sheikh. On Dr. Sheikh's transfer to Moirabari College, Dr. Sailendra Narayan Thakuria took over as i/c. Principal, Prof. Akheruzzaman, He was succeeded Dr. Thakuriya on his retirement on 31.03.2011 as i/c Principal. He was succeeded by Dr. abed Ali as regular Principal of the college on 31.01.2012 and Dr ali continued to be the principal of the of the college till his retirement on 28.02.2021. He was succeeded by P.C. Mohapatra, M.A. (English), B.Ed., P.G.C.T.E. as i/c Principal on 01.03.2021 and Prof. Mohapatra continues to be i/c Principal of the college till his retirement on 31.03.2022. He was succeeded by Dr. Sudipta Dutta, M.A., Ph.D, as i/c Principal 01/04/2022 and Dr. Dutta continues to be i/c Principal of the college till date. Now the college imparts education with an efficient and dedicated teaching staff to nearly one thousand students annually from Higher Secondary to Degree level.

At present, Mankachar College has been playing a vital role as a provincialized college in this educationally, economically and socially backward district of South Salmara-Mankachar in imparting higher education both in Arts and Science streams.

THREE YEAR DEGREE COURSE UNDER CBCS

The Mankachar College is conducting Three year Degree Course in Arts and Science Stream in Semester mode under Gauhati University. The Undergraduate Programme is in Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) which is adopted by Gauhati University from the academic session 2019-20.

A SUMMARY OF THE GU UG-CBCS+

What is UG-CBCS?

The undergraduate degree (UG) programme in the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) will have courses spread across six-semester of any undergraduate degree course. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. An UG course shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years (Academic Sessions – June to May). The duration of the Odd Semesters (First, Third and Fifth) shall be June – November, and that of Even Semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth) shall be December – May.

How does it work?

The courses in GU UG-CBCS are categorised primarily into three types of courses – Core, Elective, and Ability / Skill Enhancement courses. All the core and elective courses will comprise of six (6) credits and the skill courses are of four (4) credits.

Core Course

As the name suggests, a core course is a necessary course that a student MUST take in order to complete the degree. The number of core courses for Honours and Regular degrees are different.

Elective Course

An elective course is the one for which a student has some kind of freedom to choose from a pool of courses. There are two kinds of elective courses – Generic and Discipline Specific. The generic elective courses are those, which can be chosen by a student belonging to any stream, while the discipline specific elective courses are particular to only the discipline concerned. However, a student pursuing an honours degree course can choose a generic elective from any other discipline except from the honours course itself.

Ability / Skill Enhancement Course

An Ability or Skill Enhancement course is aimed at providing the student with skill and ability. These courses have four (4) credits each in contrast to the core or elective courses. The ability enhancement courses MUST be opted by a student and the student can choose papers from a pool of skill enhancement courses.

Dissertation/Project

A student can opt (subject to conditions) a dissertation or a project work in lieu of a 6-credit discipline specific elective course in the sixth semester.

The Notion of Credit

A student needs to earn a required number of credits in order to successfully complete a degree. The credit is closely related to the number of stipulated classes a student has to complete. The following table indicates the number of credit a student can earn for each type of indicated classes.

NATURE AND NOMENCLATURE OF COURSES:

In line with the UGC's guidelines, the courses are categorized as Core courses, Elective courses or Ability Enhancement courses.

Core Course: A Core course is a course that has to be compulsorily studied. A student in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to take up 14 core courses, each of 6 credits. In a Regular undergraduate degree programme a student will need to take up 12 core courses, each again of 6 credits.

Elective Course: An Elective course is to be chosen by the student from a pool of such courses on offer and will essentially be of three types:

Discipline Specific Elective Course:

An Elective Course which is offered by the main discipline. The discipline offering a Discipline Specific Elective course may also offer discipline related elective courses that are interdisciplinary in nature. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program with Honours will have to earn 24 course credits from Discipline Specific Elective courses. For a student enrolled in a non-Honours undergraduate degree program in science, the course credit requirement from Discipline Specific Elective courses will be 36 credits. For a student enrolled in a non-Honours undergraduate degree program in Arts and Commerce, the course credit requirement from Discipline Specific Elective courses will be 24 credits.

Generic Elective Course:

A Generic Elective Course is offered by an unrelated discipline and has the objective of broadening the academic experience of a student. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program with Honours can acquire 24 course credits from Generic Elective Courses. A Core Course offered in a discipline may be allowed as an Elective to a student from another discipline. This course will be treated under the category of Generic Elective Courses. Generic Elective Courses are not available to students in a non-Honours undergraduate science degree program while other non-Honours undergraduate programmes require enrollees to take up two such courses.

Dissertation/Project:

Engaging students in a Project / Dissertation work, which requires knowledge application and problem solving, is considered to be important in the learning process. All students enrolled in an undergraduate degree program (Honours and non-Honours) will have the option of choosing to undertake Project / Dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of a 6 credit Discipline Specific Elective course in the fifth semester only.

Ability Enhancement Courses:

Ability Enhancement Courses which are to be taken up by students in an undergraduate degree program will be of two types:

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses:

These 4 credit courses are mandatory for every student for every student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program. A student will have to take up 4 credit course in Environmental

Science and a second 4 credit course in English Communication / MIL Communication.

Skill Enhancement Courses:

Skill Enhancement Courses will be value based or skill based and there will be a pool of courses on offer. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program with Honours will have to take up a minimum of two SEC courses of 4 credits each as part of the program requirement. For students enrolled in non-Honours undergraduate degree programs the credit requirement from Skill Enhancement Courses will be 16 credits. It is desirable that the university will prepare Skill Enhancement Courses for various disciplines from the list of SEC provided by the UGC template. However colleges are free to develop their own SECs independently which must have prior approval of the Academic Council.

ATTENDENCE OF STUDENTS

A student must attend at least 75% of the total classes held in an academic session for appearing in Council and University Examinations. A student who does not attend at least 50% of the total classes held in an academic session will be declared non-collegiate and student of that category must have to pay fine of Rs. 200/- at the time of form fill up of examination.

CLASS TIME

Classes are held in day shift only. The classes start at 9.00 am and continue upto 4.00 pm.

STUDENTS' UNION

Mankachar College Students' Union is the general body of students in the college. Every regular student of the college shall be a member of this union. The office bearers are elected annually by direct franchise in accordance with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and M.C.S.U. Constitution. A regular student who does not have any academic arrears and has at least 75% class attendance shall be eligible for contesting union election provided that a student can't contest twice.

GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE

- A great emphasis laid on discipline and character building and students are expected
 to maintain a high standard in and outside the college campus. They are subject to the
 rules and regulations of the college.
- ii) The student admitted to the college must abide by the rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority. - Date of Admission will be notified by the Principal just after announcement of the result of the H.S.LC./H.S./T.D.C. Examinations.
- Prospectus and Admission Forms will be issued as per dates notified by the Principal.
- iv) Classes will start as per academic calendar of Gauhati University/College.

FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS

1. College Library:

The Digital Library of the college is well-stocked and fully-computerized. It has around 26500 books covering almost all aspects of Science & Humanities. It regularly subscribes to about 05 Periodicals including 04 daily regional and national level newspapers in Assamese and English. Services offered by the library are circulation of books among the students and faculties, consultation, reference etc. There is also a collection of materials like maps, atlases, etc. The library has comfortable Reading Rooms for students, teachers and visitors. It extends its current awareness services by providing newspapers/ magazines in the Staff Room and the Students' Common Room. The library remains open from 9.00 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. on all working days. It remains closed on Sundays and other gazetted holidays. There is a book bank facility meant for the poor needy students.



Modern Teaching Facilities:

The College has ultra-modern audiovisual teaching facilities like teaching with the aid of power board, LCD projector, etc. The College campus including the classrooms is under CCTV surveillance system. There is one computer centre in the college with 35 computers having Internet facilities. It provides basic computer education to the teachers, students and staff.

College Hostel:

The college has a hostel for girls only. The total seat capacity of the hostel is 100. The students must apply for hostel seat in a separate application form.

4. Sports Facilities:

Sports facilities in the college are available. Each year, students of the College achieve notable distinctions. Facilities are provided for Athletics, Basket Ball, Table Tennis, Volley Ball, Cricket, Badminton, Kabaddi and a number of Indoor games.




5. Gymnastics Facilities:

15. Extra Curricular & Co-Curricular Activities:

i) National Service Scheme (N.S.S.): NSS Cell, Mankachar College Unit is introduced under G.U. from the session 2012-13. This unit will render social service with inside and outside the college campus through the NSS student volunteer. The main aim of the scheme is to enable the student to upgrade their personality and experience through community service. A student enroll in NSS is expected to put in atleast 120 hours of regular NSS Programme in each academic year and shall be entitled to get a certificate on completion of 2 years term i.e. 240 hours and attending atleast one special camp.
